Join us as we set down our spiritual baggage and unpack it all, trusting the process to draw us closer to Christ.

Lenten Prayer Walk

March 26, 3:00pm Sunday (rain date 3:00pm April 2)

We invite you to join with others on a Lenten prayer walk. We will walk through locations around our community, downtown and on campus, stopping to pray intentionally for various people and issues in our midst. This walk is open to anyone able to walk for approximately 2 miles, and includes specific actions for children. Meet at Marcia's Park, at the gazebo outside the former police station. Guides are provided in the gathering space, and we plan to use the first half of the guide for the group walk. You may also walk on your own, and, if you have more time, you may choose to do a longer walk or a second walk or bike ride or car ride to use the 2nd half of the guide. The Walk, Bike or Ride section of the guide may also be used by folks who are unable to do the walk on foot. You are welcome to invite a friend to join you for this!

Are you hesitant to complete a questionnaire? Do you see yourself in the list below?

- You wonder why you should do this survey because you feel you cannot take on anything more, though you are willing to keep the commitments you already have. We ask you to complete a questionnaire as a way of acknowledging your offering as a part of the community, just as you fill out a financial pledge every year, even if it doesn't change very much.
- 2. You fill one out every year, but it seems repetitive, so why keep doing it? Ministry leaders organize activities and programs every year, and it is so much easier to ask someone to repeat a task if you know they enjoy doing it!
- 3. You have been a part of BPC for years, but have never filled out a Questionnaire or Time and Talent pledge. Can you be certain that the rest of us know your interests and abilities and what volunteer work brings you joy? If not, tell us!
- 4. You are a new member who is trying to determine how you fit in. Ministry leaders looking for volunteers are so grateful to bring folks on board that are much more than just fresh faces. Let us know what your niches of interest are!

Trex Plastic Film Recycling Update: Six-Month Challenge!

Our Trex plastic film collection has become an important neighborhood and community project! Since we began serving as a collection center in 2017, we have collected more than 4000 pounds of plastic film that would otherwise have been sent to the landfill, or might have blown away and contaminated a waterway. We have earned seven benches now placed in the locations below:

- in the Creation Care garden by the parking lot
- 3 in the younger children's/Head Start/PMO playground and the older children's playground
- at the office entrance of BPC
- on our property on Church Street next to the Little
 Free Library built by an Eagle Scout
- next to the mailboxes at the Habitat townhouses on Church Street

Our 8th bench will be ordered as soon as we have decided where we will donate it, since our property is now at capacity!

In this most recent 8th cycle, we achieved something we had not achieved before - we collected 500 pounds in less than 6 months! Crow's Nest Greenhouses has been a regular supporter of our program donating 60 - 80 pounds every few months of clean plastic film that they remove from pallets and other projects and supplies. We are so grateful for this conscientious generosity and expect it to continue, so we would now like to challenge BPC, going forward, to reach each 500 pound mark within six months!

So, please continue to tell your friends, and bring in your plastic film regularly. Be sure however, that you and all the people you know who participate are clear exactly what kind of plastic to bring and that it is always clean and dry (see chart, top right). Please read the directions near each box, and please don't "wish-cycle," since no sorting is done after it leaves our premises. We will keep you posted as to our progress on this challenge.

- Around 40 youth and adults joined to participate in a Racial Wealth Gap Learning Simulation on February 26. The youth group has also participated in other ways in the Habit Building Challenge in February.
- The Montgomery County Black History Driving Tour by Christiansburg Institute is still in development, but we will let you know when it is ready to go.

Be sure and talk with others about what you have learned, to help your new habits stick!



One prong of the Matthew 25 initiative is alleviation of poverty. People in poverty need to decide how much of their limited resources goes to the basic needs of food, health care, housing, heating. One in ten people around the world goes to bed hungry at night. One in four children under age five is severely malnourished.

Writing letters to our legislators is a way in which we can help fight hunger and poverty. The Farm Bill, which needs reauthorization this year, enables one in eight Americans to put food on the table through the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and provides international food assistance. Federal nutrition programs provide roughly 10 times as much food assistance as private churches and charities combined.

You can join other Christians in winning improvements to the Farm Bill by encouraging your members of Congress to support our nation's hunger-fighting efforts though Bread for the World's Offering of Letters on **March 19 after worship.** Hunger is not a partisan issue.

Bread for the World has been a collective Christian voice to end hunger for almost 50 years:

- BFW is non-partisan
- Studies hunger and attempted solutions
- Proposes legislation that is efficacious and cost-effective

Transformation at the Heart of CEDEPCA's Ministry



"I am here by mercy of God," she said as she proudly stood. "I was told that as a woman I was worthless and should stay in the house. Finally others persuaded me to come to the classes. Now I have learned to value myself as a woman. Now I am speaking in church and working with the youth and with other women. Now I want to

neip others. I want my children to go to school." Ana was one of more than 20 women who gathered at the center of the Association of Mayan Presbyterian Women to express their great thanks to Carolina Gonzalez, CEDEPCA's instructor who teaches the Bible to women from several different language groups in Guatemala. Most have not been to school. None have the resources for classes.

CEDEPCA provides these life-changing classes at no charge. In these classes, women find their voice and develop a new self-confidence as they discover that even they--as women--are children of God, loved by God, and empowered by God to bring change to their families and communities. As Carolina listened to testimony after testimony, she could not hold back the tears. These were new women of hope and courage who wanted to learn more from the Bible and become leaders in their church.

With a growing demand for CEDEPCA's classes, it is finally possible for Carolina to teach full time because churches and individuals have increased their giving to CEDEPCA. Thank you Blacksburg Presbyterian Church! You are making a difference!
