

- for our partners and friends in CEDEPCA in Guatemala, and for our co-workers, Betsey and Eric Moe and their family in Guatemala. We are grateful that several folks from our Presbytery and from the Presbytery of the James were able to recently visit for the first time since COVID began.
- for our mission partners, Dessa Quesada-Palm and Cobbie Palm, in the Philippines.
- for equitable, worldwide distribution of COVID vaccines, tests, and treatments, and for continued understanding of and ability to appreciate how to cope with the continued persistence of the virus. We pray that what we have learned will have a positive effect on our church and society.

#### "Young Women and Teenage Girls are Free from Violence!"



Imelda Tec Pan is a 23-year-old Maya Quiché woman who has participated in the Tamar Project to stop violence against teenage girls since 2021. This project was begun by the Women's Ministry of CEDEPCA in Guatemala, and recently expanded to activities in Costa Rica. The dream of the Women's Ministry is to implement this project through all the countries where CEDEPCA has a presence, so that teenagers and young women can increase their self-esteem, know their rights, and accomplish new dreams and new ways of being women free from violence. Meetings are conducted where they can learn about self-esteem, dignity, women's rights, types of violence and alternatives to violence, and sexual and reproductive education. After using a distance learning model in 2020 and 2021, in-person meetings became possible again in 2022.

In the workshops held in March 2022, the Women's Ministry had the opportunity to learn more about Imelda, where she shared that being a part of the Tamar Project had helped her a great deal, and continues to help her, because she has been able to identify what violence – especially sexual violence – is. Imelda shares in her own words: "It has helped me a lot to know what our rights are, how we can put it into practice, how we can help develop ourselves and how we can help others. From my end, I share about this with my friends, my sisters, and my mother...[W]hen I had the opportunity to participate in the Tamar [Project] I was very happy because I knew that it would help me, and it already has!"... In 2023, Imelda will complete the entire Tamar program which has three phases (one for each year), from 2021 to 2023. This year she also hopes to complete her studies and graduate as a teacher of bilingual intercultural preschool education.

Like Imelda, there are many teenagers and young people who desire to continue studying and learning. We invite you to be a part of this dream, and to participate together with the Women's Ministry to reach more teenage girls and young women through this project. And please join us for the virtual journey on May 24 see above)!


